Water tanks supported directly on grade if the capacity does not exceed 5000 gallons (18925 L) and the ratio of height to diameter or width does not exceed 2:1. 6. Sidewalks and driveways not more than 30 inches (762 mm) above adjacent grade, and not over any basements or story below and are not part of an accessible route. 7. Painting, papering, tilling, carpeting, cabinets, countertops and similar finish work. 8. Temporary motion, picture, television, and theater stage sets and scenery. 9. Prefabricated swimming pools accessory to a Group R-3 occupancy that are less than 24 inches (610 mm) deep, are not greater than 5,000 gallons (18925 L) and are installed entirely above ground. 10. Shade cloth structures constructed for nursery or agricultural purposes, not	 103.1.1 Exempt Work. A permit shall not be required for the following: The stopping of leaks in drains, soil, waste or vent pipe, provided, however, that should any trap, drainpipe, soil, waste or vent pipe become defective and it becomes necessary to remove and replace the same with new material, the same shall be considered as new work and a permit shall be produced and inspection made as provided in the Code. (1) The clearing of stoppages including the removal ad reinstallation of water closets, or (2) The repairing of leaks in pipes, valves or fixtures, provided such repairs do not involve or require the replacement or rearrangement of valves, pipes or fixtures.

The authority having jurisdiction shall be authorized to establish and issue permits, certificates, notices, and approvals, or orders pertaining to electrical safety hazards pursuant to Article 89, except that no permit shall be required to execute any of the classed of electrical work specified in the following: 89.101.3.3 Exempted from this Code. This code does not cover: (A) 1. Installations in ships, watercraft other than floating dwelling units, railway rolling stock, aircraft, automotive vehicles, commercial coaches, mobilehomes, and recreational vehicles. (B) 2. Installations underground in mines, mine shafts and tunnels. (C) 3. Installation of railways for generation, transformation, transmission, or distribution of power used exclusively for signaling and communication purposes. (D) 4. Installation of communication equipment under the exclusive control of communication utilities, located outdoors or in building spaces used exclusively for such installations. (E) 5. Installations under the exclusive control of electrical utilities for the purpose of communication, or metering; or for the generation, control, transformation, transmission, and distribution of electrical energy located in buildings used exclusively by utilities for such purposes or located outdoors on property owned or leased by the utility or on public highways, streets, roads, etc., or outdoors by established rights on private preparty.

An electrical permit shall not be required for the following when located in buildings under the authority of the California Department of Housing and Community Development. 1. Listed cord and plug connected temporary decorative lighting. 2. Reinstallation of attachment plug receptacles, but not the outlets therefore. 3. Repair or replacement of branch circuit overcurrent devices of the required capacity in the same location. 4. Installation or maintenance of communications wiring, devices, appliances, apparatus or equipment. Exemptions from permit and inspection requirements shall not be deemed to grant authorization for any work to be done in any manner in violation of any other provision of law or this code.
