CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

The Parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Priority of Documents</u>

Each of the items listed below is hereby incorporated into this Agreement by this reference. In the event of an inconsistency in this Agreement, the inconsistency shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:

- A. Applicable Federal and State of California statutes and regulations, this Agreement and its exhibits.
- B. CONTRACTOR'S Proposal dated June 10, 2013.

2. <u>Scope of Professional Services:</u>

CONTRACTOR agrees to provide on call Street Light Maintenance, per Scope of Service attached.

3. <u>Term of Agreement:</u>

This Agreement shall commence on the date of execution by the MHCSD General Manager, and continue until June 30, 2014, unless said work is completed on a date prior thereto or unless terminated earlier as provided herein.

4. <u>Compensation:</u>

The compensation shall not exceed the amount of \$35,000 for services performed pursuant to this Agreement. Payments shall be made within 30 days of receipt of invoice from CONTRACTOR.

5. <u>Invoicing:</u>

CONTRACTOR shall submit one original and one copy of each invoice to the MHCSD, 230 S. Sterling Drive, Suite 100, Mountain House, CA 95391. All invoices must reference this Contract ID Number, the service performed and the Federal Tax Payer Identification Number. Payments will be made against invoices as submitted.

6. <u>CONTRACTOR's Status:</u>

In the performance of work, duties and obligations imposed by this Agreement, the CONTRACTOR is at all times acting as an Independent Contractor practicing his or her profession and not as an employee of the MHCSD. CONTRACTOR shall perform the CONTRACTOR's work in accordance with currently approved methods and standards of practice in the CONTRACTOR's professional specialty. A copy of CONTRACTOR's current business license shall be provided to MHCSD. The CONTRACTOR shall not have any claim under this Agreement or otherwise against the DISTRICT for vacation, sick leave, retirement benefits, social security or worker's compensation benefits. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for federal and state payroll taxes such as social security and unemployment. MHCSD will issue a form 1099 at year-end for fees earned.

7. Assignments:

Inasmuch as this Agreement is intended to secure the specialized services of the CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR may not assign, transfer, delegate or subcontract their obligation herein without the prior written consent of MHCSD. Any such assignment, transfer, delegation or subcontract without the prior written consent shall be considered null and void.

8. <u>Non-Exclusive Rights:</u>

This Agreement does not grant to CONTRACTOR any exclusive privileges or rights to provide services to MHCSD. CONTRACTOR may contract with other counties, private companies or individuals for similar services.

9. Indemnification:

The CONTRACTOR agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT its officers, agents, employees and volunteers for any and all liability to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness or willful wrongful act of the CONTRACTOR arising out of the performance of this agreement, and to pay all claims, damages, judgments, legal costs, adjuster fees and attorney fees relating thereto, with set-off due to the Contractor's rights, if any to apportionment between joint tortfeasors. This indemnity obligation extends to CONTRACTOR's proportionate share of liability resulting from all negligent, reckless or willfully wrongful acts, errors or omissions, and active and/or passive negligence by the CONTRACTOR and excludes the negligence, recklessness or willful wrongful acts of MHCSD.

10. <u>Insurance</u>:

CONTRACTOR if required to work on MHCSD property during the contract period, shall submit proof of insurance to MHCSD showing Mountain House Community Services District, its officers, agents and employees named as Additional Insured and insurance policy shall contain provisions that such policy may not be canceled except after thirty (30) days written notice to the MHCSD, ten (10) days notice if cancellation is due to nonpayment of premium.

CONTRACTOR agrees that CONTRACTOR is responsible to insure that the requirements set forth in this article/paragraph are also be met by CONTRACTOR'S subcontractors/consultants who provide services pursuant to this Agreement. Copies of insurance certificates shall be filed with the MHCSD.

11. Discrimination:

CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any individual based on race, color, religion, nationality, sex, age, or handicap condition.

12. Notices:

Any notice required to be given pursuant to the terms and provisions hereof shall be in writing and shall be effected by personal delivery or by first class mail, registered or certified, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. Unless otherwise designated by either party in writing, such notices shall be mailed as shown on Page 1.

13. <u>Termination:</u>

If the CONTRACTOR breaches or habitually neglects the CONTRACTOR's duties under this Agreement without curing such breach or neglect upon fifteen (15) working days written notice, the MHCSD may, by written notices, immediately terminate this Agreement without prejudice to any other remedy to which MHCSD may be entitled, either at law, in equity, or under this Agreement. In addition, either party may terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days written notice to other party.

14. <u>Conflict of Interest Statement:</u>

CONTRACTOR covenants that CONTRACTOR, its officers or employees or their immediate family, presently has no interest, including, but not limited to, other projects or independent contracts, and shall not acquire any such interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required to be performed under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR further covenants that in the performance of this Agreement no person having any such interest shall be employed or retained by CONTRACTOR under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall not hire MHCSD's employees to perform any portion of the work or services provided for herein including secretarial, clerical and similar incidental services except upon the written approval of MHCSD. Performance of services under this Agreement by associates or employees of CONTRACTOR shall not relieve CONTRACTOR from any responsibility under this Agreement.

15. Drug Free Workplace:

CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions of Government Code Section 8350 et seq., otherwise known as the Drug-Free Workplace Act.

16. Force Majeure

It is agreed that neither party shall be responsible for delays in delivery or acceptance of delivery or failure to perform when such delay or failure is attributable to Acts of God, war, strikes, riots, lockouts, accidents, rules or regulations of any governmental agencies or other matters or conditions beyond the control of either the seller/contractor or the purchaser.

17. Compliance:

CONTRACTOR shall comply with all Federal, State and local laws, regulations and requirements necessary for the provision of contracted services. Furthermore,

CONTRACTOR shall comply with all laws applicable to wages and hours of employment, occupational safety, and to fire safety, health and sanitation. CONTRACTOR shall maintain current throughout the life of this Agreement, all permits, licenses, certificates and insurances that are necessary for the provision of contracted services

18. Form Law:

The Laws of the State of California shall govern this Agreement. Venue is San Joaquin County. The provision of this paragraph shall survive expiration or other termination of this Agreement regardless of the cause of such termination.

19. Documents:

All drawings, specifications, documents and other memoranda or writings relating to the work and services hereunder, shall remain or become the property of the MHCSD whether executed by or for the CONTRACTOR for MHCSD, or otherwise by or for the CONTRACTOR, or by or for a subcontractor operating under the CONTRACTOR'S supervision, or direction, and all such documents and copies thereof shall be returned or transmitted to MHCSD forthwith upon termination or completion of the work under this Agreement.

20. Entire Agreement and Modification:

This Agreement supersedes all previous Agreements either oral or in writing and constitutes the entire understanding of the parties hereto. No changes, amendments or alterations shall be effective unless in writing and signed by both parties.

SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STREET LIGHTS

This Scope of Work is for the maintenance of street lights (double mast arms, single mast arms and post tops), path lights (within the parks), basketball and tennis court lights and lighted bollards (along pedestrian pathways) within Mountain House.

EXHIBIT "A" - Street light counts

- 1) The CONTRACTOR agrees to provide the Mountain House Community Services District (MHCSD) a contact list with phone numbers and e-mail. An emergency after hours contact number will also be required. Emergency response times should not exceed 2 hours. All emergency repairs need to be completed within 24 hours. If parts need to be ordered, the location must be left in a safe condition.
- 2) CONTRACTOR will supply all labor, material, and equipment to trouble-shoot and repair any/all MHCSD owned post top, double or single mast arm electroliers, and park lighting (path lights and basketball and tennis court lights) as directed by the MHCSD.
 - a. The work will include the repair or replacement of underground street lighting conduit, conductors, pull boxes and fuse assemblies as well as lamps, ballasts, photoelectric cells (PEC's) as well as associated internal fixture wiring.
 - i. The CONTRACTOR shall do all repairs and replacements in accordance the current MHCSD Standards, Specifications and Details (available at MHCSD).
 - b. The fixtures shall be cleaned after repairs have been made.
 - c. The repair of individual electroliers components, as listed above, will be at time, material, and equipment rates as quoted in the Contractor's pricing schedule.
- 3) The CONTRACTOR will also repair or replace, as directed, Street light pole assemblies which have been physically damaged by cars, trucks, or other causes. All repairs shall be in accordance to the MHCSD's current Standards, Specifications and Details.
 - a. Cost for replacement of entire fixtures, pole shafts, or concrete foundations shall be through a proposal by the CONTRACTOR in writing to the MHCSD on a case by case basis.
 - b. Prior to the replacement of such items, the MHCSD will authorize the CONTRACTOR, in writing to proceed with the work.
- 4) Routine on-call maintenance will be carried out under a Work Request form generated by an MHCSD representative and billed according to the Cost Proposal submitted by the Contractor.
- 5) Repairs estimated above \$1,000 will need a proposal and shall be submitted for approval to the O&M Director prior to any repairs. Non Routine repairs under \$1,000 can be charged on a Time and Material Basis per the T&M rates submitted. The Contractor shall inform the CSD of all non-routine repairs.

- 6) Day/Night checks are to be performed by the contractor on a monthly basis. After completion of day/night check a list of recommended repairs needs to be provided to the CSD. The repairs shall be billed according to the proposed rate provided by the contractor.
 - a) Day/Night checks are to include the following:
 - i) All double and single headed major street lights (Arterial)
 - ii) All single post top neighborhood street lights
 - iii) All illuminated bollards within the neighborhood alleyways
 - iv) All the lights along Walker Way
 - v) All Park path lights
 - vi) All Basketball and Tennis Court lights

7) POLE NUMBERS

- a) Pole numbers are to be replaced as necessary or as directed by the CSD.
- b) The CONTRACTOR is responsible for supplying the pole numbers (7/8" x ½").

MHCSD reserves the right to request a lump sum or a T&M Estimate for each item.

Proposal Exhibit "A" - Scope of Services

BES will provide a comprehensive twelve month street light, path light, basketball and tennis court light, and lighted bollards routine maintenance, responsive maintenance, and emergency repair service contract by providing Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) Licensed Journeyman electricians as well as a California Professional Engineer-licensed Traffic Engineer as part of our standard service.

BES electricians are Level II International Municipal Signal Association Field & Bench Certified (minimum) and are all licensed by the DIR as required by the State of California to practice in signal maintenance.

Upon award of the contract, BES engineers will setup a meeting with the District and provide all necessary equipment submittals, project schedules, as well as 24/7/365 days on-call dispatch system log-in and phone numbers.

WORK APPROACH

Upon notice to proceed, as part of our standard service, BES engineers and electricians will setup a meeting with MHCSD staff and establish the following:

- Establish a list of District authorized "callers";
- Establish a proper, recommended "value-added" preventative maintenance routine that
 meets and exceeds the District's expectations complete with proposed monthly reporting
 and real-time internet/email status via BES;
- Submit proposed maintenance logs for District approval;
- Propose to have a monthly meeting with a BES Engineer to go over preventative maintenance found in the District;
- Train District staff on the BES On-line system;
- Formal introduction of the BES team including field staff, accounting team, and project management.

PREVENTATIVE AND ROUTINE MAINTENANCE

BES licensed journeymen will perform the following monthly services upon notice to proceed from the District as part of the standard monthly routine exercises.

- Replacement of lenses, gaskets, reflectors, ballasts, igniters, sockets, and all integral
 parts of the light fixture that have failed through normal deterioration, with either a like
 item or selected upgrade to ensure the roadways and public facilities are properly
 illuminated.
 - Reports of outages or dayburners can be made via phone, email, and BES customer portal
- 2. Replace lamps in-kind by virtue of a burnout.
- Replace PECs that have become inoperative.
- 4. Provide minor tree trimming below the light fixture for the purpose of allowing a reasonable amount of light to be let through.

- 5. Perform day/night checks of arterial roadway streetlights, public facilities, and safety lights once a month during non-daylight hours.
- 6. Maintain and submit a monthly log of night checks.

RESPONSIVE MAINTENANCE AND EMERGENCY REPAIR

BES approach is to provide the most responsive and efficient repair for MHCSD.

- Since BES will be the MHCSD's Street Light Signal Maintenance Contractor for FY
 13/14 , BES' field office and operations will provide 24/7/365 operations for the District already.
- 2. The BES field office, located at <u>41556 Boscell Road</u>, Fremont will house all major equipment and material for MHCSD.
- 3. BES can respond to accident sites, disconnect power, secure the site for public safety, take down damaged poles, or pick up knocked down streetlight material as part of our standard emergency response.
- 4. BES shall make immediate maintenance calls when notified by an authorized District personnel no longer than 2 hours from the time of notification and emergency repairs will be completed within 24 hours. When parts are needed the location will be left in safe condition.
- 5. Maintain and submit a monthly log listing of each call received with caller's name, date and time of call, the outage or other problem reported by the caller.
- 6. BES will be self-performing all work as part of this contract including all traffic control, minor concrete, and electrical work.
- 7. BES will maintain a 24-hour 1-800-GOBEAR1 phone line for all MHCSD staff to provide trouble calls.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- BES shop and storage facilities are located inside City of Fremont limits at 41556 Boscell Road. The BES shop contains a 1,000 SF office as well as 5,000 SF of yard and parking space – fully secured and paved for efficient streetlight maintenance operations.
- 2. BES intends to self-perform all work activities specified in this contract as well as either own/leases all the equipment required to perform this work. All personnel are licensed and fully trained as required by State Law.
- 3. BES field superintendent, Joshua Bailey, has eight (8) years of field and management experience managing the District streetlight maintenance contract under another company. As part owner of BES, Joshua Bailey brings the same experience to this contract and is capable of providing proper expectations and instructions to his subordinates in order to provide a successful maintenance program to the Mountain House Community.
- 4. All BES personnel assigned to this contract are minimum Level II IMSA Electrician including the project manager, Robert Asuncion.
- 5. BES personnel are all knowledgeable in providing proper traffic control and typical traffic control plans can be provided in advance of start of contract to ensure mutual understanding of the traffic control approach by BES.

- (3) service trucks that will service this account. A crane and digger derrick are currently rentals for BES and plans to purchase those equipment 4-8 months from submission of this contract.
- 10. BES will cooperate with other forces or by other contractors within the MHCSD limits in the event their coincides with the scope of this project.
- 11. BES principals, Joshua Bailey and Robert Asuncion, have a combined 16 years of experience in the private sector performing this contract for various City's (under Republic ITS). Moreover, Robert Asuncion worked for the City of Fremont as Associate Transportation Engineer for an additional five (5) years.
- 12. BES will provide a real-time maintenance management software within 45 days of notice to proceed by the MHCSD.
- 13. BES has a 24/7/365 live call center operation based in Alviso, CA with an out-sourced back up call center locally based in the San Francisco in the event BES dispatch staff is off-line.
- 14. BES is highly conscious of the environment and has best management practices in place as part of our standard operating protocol when it comes to waste disposal and fleet management.
- 15. As previously mentioned, BES's standard hiring practices is such that all personnel is properly licensed and trained and compliant with all local, state, and federal labor compliance.

WARRANTY

BES will be responsible for making contact between any equipment manufacturers and the District staff when service is needed during the warranty period for any products installed by BES. BES will remain in contact with the District to ensure their satisfaction. In addition to the manufacturer's warranty, BES will warranty all work and materials which we install for a 12 month period.

6. In the spirit of maintaining high work integrity and limit the inconvenience of the traveling public, BES will perform all work in an expedient manner.

- 7. BES currently possesses a California C-10 contractor's license. The C-31 and A licenses are pending testing and should be in hand within 6-10 weeks from submission of this proposal; as such BES intends to comply with all license requirements of the District's RFP during the life of the contract.
- 8. BES project manager, Robert Asuncion, is a licensed traffic engineer with the state of California. Additionally, several project managers reporting to Robert have a civil engineer license in-house.
- 9. Currently, BES wholly owns (3) bucket trucks, (2) air compressors, (2) dump trucks, and
